#### Call to Order and Determination of Quorum

#### **Special Order of Business:**

#### 2016 Annual Audit Exit Conference and Financial Statements

Lisa McCargar, Chief Financial Officer, introduced Moss Adams, independent auditors. Present were Derek Criswell, Partner, Kevin Reynolds, Audit Senior, and James Lanzarotta, Partner via telephone. The team from Moss Adams provided the GSFA and RCRC Executive Committees, and the NHF Board of Directors with an overview of the financial statements for RCRC, GSFA and NHF. Mr. Criswell noted that RCRC, GSFA, and NHF received unqualified "clean" opinions, and there were no significant matters identified. No audit adjustments were proposed.

The GSFA and RCRC Executive Committees and the NHF Board of Directors met privately with the Moss Adams team to pose questions and/or comments. Staff exited the room at 9:34 a.m. and returned to the room at 9:52 a.m.

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that the GSFA Executive Committee, acting in their function as the Audit Committee, review and approve the 2016 audited financial statements and information letter as presented for presentation to and adoption by the GSFA Board of Directors.

Supervisor Les Baugh, Shasta County, motioned to approve the 2016 financial statements and information letter as presented. Supervisor Matt Kingsley, Inyo County, seconded the motion. Motion unanimously passed.

At 9:56 a.m., the simultaneous meeting of the GSFA Executive Committee, NHF Board of Directors, and the RCRC Executive Committee was adjourned.

#### **GSFA Quarterly Reports**

Lisa McCargar, Chief Financial Officer, presented the GSFA Quarterly Investment Report, the Budget Report, and the Cash and Securities Asset Report for the period ending March 31, 2017.

#### GSFA 2017 Local Area Investment Fund (LAIF) Authorization

Lisa McCargar informed the GSFA Executive Committee that GSFA maintains investments in LAIF with the California State Treasurer's Office. The Executive Director and Deputy Director previously had authority to transfer funds to and from LAIF. Ms. McCargar reported that as a result of the former Deputy Director retiring, authority permissions needed to be altered. Ms. McCargar recommended that in addition to the Executive Director and Deputy Director that the Chief Financial Officer should be given authority to transact on behalf of GSFA.

#### Recommendation

It is recommended that the GSFA Executive Committee approve the addition of the Chief Financial Officer as an authorized individual to deposit or withdraw funds in LAIF, and direct the GSFA Executive Director to make the same recommendation to the GSFA Board of Directors.

Supervisor David Rogers, Madera County, motioned to approve the above recommendations. Supervisor John Viegas, Glenn County, seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### **Program Updates**

Craig Ferguson, Deputy Director, provided an update on the single and multifamily programs, the PACE Program, the Infrastructure Finance Program, and the Mortgage Credit Certificate allocation for GSFA.

Greg Norton received an email from the GSFA Chair, Supervisor Kevin Cann, Mariposa County, asking that Mr. Norton read the email to the GSFA Executive Committee. Mr. Norton read a very complimentary email from a GSFA Platinum Program recipient thanking the GSFA Chair and the GSFA full board of Directors for their program. The home buyer stated that he was able to buy the home of his dreams thanks to this wonderful program.


