Public Comment

Robert Bendorf Jr., Renovate America / Hero, was present and offered to answer any questions in regards to the HERO program.

George Apostolopoulos, Ygrene Energy Fund, was present and offered to answer questions on the PACE program or or current proposed legislation relating to PACE. Mr. Apostolopoulos also offered to visit any County Supervisors meeting if so desired on the PACE topic.

GSFA 2016 Audited Financial Statements

Lisa McCargar, CFO, informed the GSFA Board of Directors that Moss Adams LLP, independent auditors, concluded its audit in April. Moss Adams issued financial statements and a communication letter which contained a clean audit opinion. Ms. McCargar reported that the financial statements and communication letter had been reviewed and approved by the GSFA Executive Committee, in their capacity as the Audit Committee, at their May 10, 2017 meeting.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the GSFA Board of Directors approve and adopt the 2016 audited financial statements and communication letter as presented.

Supervisor Dan Miller, Nevada County, motioned to approve the 2016 GSFA Audited Financial Statements and Communication Letter as presented. Supervisor Lynn Morgan, Amador County, seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

GSFA 2017 Local Area Investment Fund (LAIF) Authorization

Lisa McCargar informed the GSFA Board of Directors that GSFA maintains investments in LAIF with the California State Treasurer's Office. The Executive Director and Deputy Director previously had authority to transfer funds to and from LAIF. As a result of the former Deputy Director retiring, authority permissions needed revision. Ms. McCargar recommended that The Executive Director, Chief Financial Officer and recently appointed Deputy Director be authorized to transact with LAIR on behalf of GSFA. The GSFA Executive Committee, at their meeting on May 10, 2017, had reviewed, approved, and recommended that this issue be taken to the board for approval.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the GSFA Board of Directors approve the addition of the Chief Financial Officer as an authorized individual to deposit or withdraw funds in LAIF.

Supervisor David Griffith, Alpine County, motioned to approve the above recommendations. Supervisor Larry Munger, Sutter County, seconded the motion. Motion passed.

GSFA Membership Status Update

Greg Norton, Executive Director, informed the GSFA Board of Directors that after January 18, 2017 when the Board approved Resolution 17-01, listing GSFA Members,

one additional associate member city has joined GSFA. Mr. Norton explained that GSFA's current list of members includes thirty-three member counties, twenty-two associate member counties, two-hundred four associate member cities, and one associate member joint powers authority.

GSFA Disaster Assistance Update

Greg Norton provided the GSFA Board of Directors with an update on the Disaster Assistance funds that the Board approved in 2015 to assist both Lake and Calaveras Counties impacted by devastating wildfires. Mr. Norton reported that over 47 Calaveras County families were assisted and read quotes from some of the families.

Program Updates

Craig Ferguson, Deputy Director, provided an update on the existing Housing and Energy Programs.

Resolution 17-07: Disaster Relief Assistance - ACTION

Summary

On July 16, 2017, the Detwiler Fire started in Mariposa County and rapidly burned thousands of acres of land as well as a number of residences and out buildings. As a result of the fire, Mariposa County was declared a state and federal emergency.

<u>Issue</u>

GSFA is proposing to allocate \$163,000 in disaster funding. The funding would be provided directly to the Mariposa Community Foundation to allocate assistance for the costs of providing temporary housing and/or shelter to individuals and families that have been displaced due to the loss of their residence from the fires and/or to assist with efforts to obtain permanent residence. The \$163,000 includes up to \$2,500 for each of the 63 households displaced and up to 3% administration costs.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the GSFA Board of Directors review and approve GSFA Resolution 17-07: Disaster Relief Assistance.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-07

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE GOLDEN STATE FINANCE AUTHORITY APPROVING AND ADOPTING EMERGENCY DISASTER ASSISTANCE FOR MARIPOSA COUNTY RESIDENTS DISPLACED BY THE DETWILER FIRE

WHEREAS, the Golden State Finance Authority ("GSFA") is a joint powers authority comprised of member and associate member counties and cities, which provides affordable housing and energy efficiency programs; and

WHEREAS, extremely dry conditions continue to exist in many parts of California; and

WHEREAS, a devastating fire began on July 16 in Mariposa County, which has resulted in multiple residents being left homeless; and

WHEREAS, the State of California and/or the United States Government have declared the fire-stricken area to be a disaster area; and

WHEREAS, GSFA desires to provide assistance to those individuals and families who have lost their primary residence for an extended period of time;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

GSFA hereby allocates a total amount of One Hundred and Sixty Three Thousand Dollars (\$163,000) of unrestricted funds to be used for emergency disaster assistance to assist residents in Mariposa County who meet the following criteria:

- The residence is in an area declared to be a state or federal disaster area in 2017;
- Damaged property caused by the disaster must have been the primary residence (owned or rented) of the applicant;
- The property must have been designated by CALFIRE as destroyed (more than 50% damaged);
- The assistance is to benefit the individuals/families that have been displaced;

The funding would be provided directly to the Mariposa Community Foundation for assistance for the costs of providing temporary housing and/or shelter and/or with efforts to obtain permanent residence to individuals and families that have been displaced due to the loss of their residence from the fires.

The \$163,000 includes up to \$2,500 for each of the 63 households displaced and up to 3% administration costs.
