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GSFA ADVANCE REBATE PAYMENT (ARP) PROGRAM PROGRAM TERM SHEET

The Self-Generation Incentive Program – Equity Resiliency Budget (**SGIP-ERB**) under the California Public Utilities Commission (**CPUC**) provides incentives for of energy storage technologies to customers in California who live in Tier 2 or Tier 3 High Fire Threat Districts (**HFTD**) or have had two or more Public Safety Power Shutoff (**PSPS**) events and require electricity for medical, health and safety of ratepayers. Though these incentives are generous it is believed that there are instances where out-of-pocket cost to the ratepayer required for equipment ordering and installation, prior to program reimbursement presents a barrier to participation.

Golden State Finance Authority (**GSFA**) Advance Rebate Payment (**ARP**) Program helps alleviate this problem by providing upfront bridge funding (**ARP Funds**) to the SGIP Developer on behalf of the homeowner for SGIP-ERB approved projects.

ARP Funds	Applicant agrees to assign GSFA as the recipient of the SGIP-ERB incentive. By doing so, GSFA will provide ARP Funds, on behalf of the Applicant, to the Developer in Advance of the incentive, or Rebate. The SGIP-ERB incentive will be sent directly to GSFA, as they are assigned the recipient of the incentive, thus reimbursing the advanced GSFA ARP funds.
	ARP Funds are provided though GSFA and through a grant from the State of California Energy Commission (CEC), as part of an award to the CEC by the Federal Department of Energy under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act.
	Funds are limited. Completed ARP applications will be approved on a first-come, first-serve basis.
Distribution of Funds	ARP Funds are distributed in two installments:
	 The first, prior to project implementation, assist the Developer with the procurement of equipment and other related items; and
	The final payment to the Developer occurs after project completion, upon approval of the Incentive Claim Application by the SGIP Program Administrator.
Fees or Costs to Applicant	None. No program fees or cost are passed on to the Applicant or the Developer. Developers are not to charge Applicant any fees or costs for participating in the GSFA ARP Program.
ARP Program Eligibility	ARP Applicant must have an approved single-family SGIP-ERB reservation as illustrated by an SGIP-ERB Confirmed Reservation Letter. Multifamily and non-Residential SGIP-ERB projects are not allowed under the GSFA ARP Program.
Project Eligibility	Project must be a single-family residence that meets SGIP-ERB criteria:
	Criteria: Eligibility Requirement
	a) Property located in a Tier 2 or Tier 3 HFTD; or,
	b) Have experienced two or more PSPS events prior to the date of Application. AND:
	a) Be Equity Budget eligible; or,
	h) Have a serious illness/condition that is life threatening if electricity is disconnected; or
	c) Eligible for medical baseline program; or,
	d) Household reliant on electric pump wells for water supplies.
Participating Developer Eligibility	Must be an approved SGIP Developer in good standing under SGIP.
	Must be in good standing with the State of California Contractors State Licensing Board.
	Must be in good standing with the Better Business Bureau.
	Must maintain Commercial General Liability Insurance, Workers Compensation Insurance, and Surety Bond Insurance.
	GSFA reserves the right to review Developer Eligibility requirements at any time, and to request any necessary documentation to do so.
